D+ News: November 2022

- **Australian** researchers have found remnants of the oldest meal on record in fossils of a strange slug-like creature called Kimberella, which lived half a billion years ago.
- Team Atlas, a robotics team composed of **Bangladeshi** university students, won gold medal at the International Science and Invention Fair (ISIF) 2022 in the Technology Category (University) for their project named 'Fremo - A Farming Robot'.
- Researchers in **Canada** have discovered at least two new minerals that have never before been seen on Earth in a 15-tonne meteorite found in Somalia — the ninth largest meteorite ever found. The two newly discovered minerals have been named elaliite and elkinstantonite.
- Three **Chinese** astronauts took off for the Tiangong space station, to make its first in-orbit crew handover on the country's space station, onboard manned spaceship Shenzhou-15.
- **Danish** 19-year-old Holger Rune beat hot favourite Novak Djokovic 3-6, 6-3, 7-5 to win his first Masters tennis title in Paris.
- Archaeologists in **Egypt** have discovered an underground tunnel at Taposiris Magna, a temple dedicated to Osiris, the god of death. The tunnel, 6.5-foot-tall, 4,300-foot-long roughly 43 feet underground at the temple, which is situated west of the ancient city of Alexandria.
- **England** won the 2022 T20 Cricket World Cup final by five wickets against Pakistan at the MCG in Melbourne chasing 137 runs with ease.
- **France's** Caroline Garcia put on a serving masterclass to claim the biggest tennis title of her career by defeating Aryna Sabalenka 7-6(4) 6-4 to win the WTA Finals in Fort Worth, Texas.
- **Greek** photographer Angelos Tzortzinis was awarded the first prize in the Sports Pictures Story category at the Atlanta Photojournalism Seminar 2022 photography competition for his black and white series telling the story of young migrants passionate about basketball.
- **India's** first privately built rocket Vikram-S, by a Hyderabad-based start-up Skyroot Aerospace Private Limite, blasted off from the Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) spaceport in Sriharikota.
- **Iranian** human rights lawyer, Nasrin Sotoudeh, won the Robert Badinter Award at the 8th World Congress Against the Death Penalty in Berlin.
- **Italian** Culture Ministry announced the extraordinary discovery of more than 2,000-year-old bronze statues in the sacred baths of the San Casciano dei Bagni archaeological dig near Siena.
- **Japan's** Daiki Hashimoto dethroned reigning champion Zhang Boheng to win the men's all-around final at the World Gymnastics Championships in Liverpool.
- **New Zealand** won the 2022 Women's Rugby World Cup in a thrilling final beating England 34-31 at Eden Park.
- Yusuf Anka of **Nigeria** won the 2022 Sony Impact award at the Rory Peck Awards for his courageous and important work on 'The Bandit Warlords of Zamfara'.
- In **Papua New Guinea** researchers have rediscovered a large pigeon, *Otidiphaps insularis*.
