D+ News: November 2017

- **Afghan** cricket team pulled off a stunning 185-run victory against Pakistan to clinch the Under-19 Asia Cup for the first time.
- **Argentine** football superstar Lionel Messi received his fourth European Golden Shoe award after netting 37 times in La Liga in 2016-17.
- The world's largest lithium ion battery, which has 100 megawatts of capacity and designed to store renewable energy, was successfully installed in South **Australia**.
- **Austrian, Italian and German** scientists have, for the first time ever, successfully treated a child suffering from extensive skin damage using genetically modified skin transplants from its own stem cells.
- Dr Samir Saha of **Bangladesh** received the 2017 Carlos J. Finlay UNESCO Prize for Microbiology at the 39th session of the General Conference of UNESCO for his research works in Bangladesh.
- **Burkina Faso** launched West Africa's biggest solar power plant in November 2017. The 55-hectare (135-acre) plant at Zagtoui on the outskirts of the capital Ouagadougou will be able to churn out 33 megawatts.
- **China** launched two BeiDou-3 satellites into space via a single carrier rocket to support its global navigation and positioning network.
- **Denmark** secured the last qualifying spot in Europe for FIFA World Cup in Russia 2018 with a 5-1 victory against Republic of Ireland.
- Former President of **Ecuador** and internationally renowned economist Rafael Correa was awarded an honorary doctorate by the Université Grenoble Alpes in France.
- Scientists in **Egypt** have discovered a passenger plane-sized hidden chamber in Egypt's Great Pyramid of Giza, in what would be the first such discovery in the structure since the 19th century.
- For the ninth-year in a row, **Iceland** ranked as the world's most gender-equal country, according to the World Economic Forum's Global Gender Gap index.
- **Indian** medical student Manushi Chhillar was crowned Miss World at a glitzy event, making her country the joint-most successful in the beauty pageant's history.
- Srijana Karki of **Nepal** won the 2017 N-Peace Award in Untold Stories category for creating awareness against sexual violence.
- After three decades of hard work and collaboration with partners, the **Philippines**, has achieved Maternal and Neonatal Tetanus Elimination (MNTE) status.
- Miss **South Africa** Demi-Leigh Nel-Peters was crowned as the 66th Miss Universe.
- **Syrian** striker Omar Khrbin was named the 2017 Asian Football Confederation's Player of the Year.
- **American** space research institute NASA launched a next-generation satellite, called the Joint Polar Satellite System-1 (JPSS-1), into space designed to monitor weather around the world.
