D+ News: November 2018

- **Canada** Topped the List of D+ World's Most Positive Countries in 2018 for the First Time Ever.
- **Australian** and **Indonesian** researchers have identified the earliest known painting of an animal, from 40,000 years ago, in a cave on the island of Borneo, Indonesia.
- **Bangladesh** boys clinched SAFF U-15 Football Championship after beating Pakistan 3-2 on penalties in the final in Nepal.
- Veselin Atanasov of **Bulgaria** was named Photographer of the Year at the 2018 EPSON International Pano Awards for his image titled Combing The Sunlight.
- **China** sent two new satellites of the BeiDou Navigation Satellite System into space on a Long March-3B carrier rocket from the Xichang Satellite Launch Center in Sichuan province.
- **Egyptian** and **French** archaeologists unveiled a new ancient tomb, sarcophagi and funerary artifacts discovered in the Theban necropolis of Al-Assasif in the southern city of Luxor in Egypt.
- The UN Security Council unanimously agreed to lift the arms embargo, travel ban, assets freeze and targeted sanctions previously imposed on **Eritrea** after nine years.
- Former diplomat Salome Zurabishvili was elected as **Georgia**'s first woman President.
- **Irish** rugby union player Johnny Sexton won the 2018 World Rugby Player of the Year Award and became the first Irishman to win the men's player of the year award since Keith Wood in 2001.
- **Japanese** football club Kashima Antlers claimed their maiden AFC Champions League title after a goalless draw in the second leg of the final against Persepolis securing a 2-0 aggregate victory.
- As-Samer, a dance performed during marriage ceremonies in **Jordan**, was inscribed on the UNESCO's Intangible Heritage list.
- **Filipino** journalist Inday Espina-Varona won the Reporters Without Borders' 2018 Prize for Independence for her extensive reporting on sensitive issues.
- A team of researchers affiliated with several institutions in **Singapore** has developed an eyepatch with dissolvable needles for use in treating eye diseases.
- **South Korea** successfully test-launched a space rocket projectile to test the country's first indigenously-developed space vehicle engine, designed and developed by the Korea Aerospace Research Institute (KARI).
- **Spanish** astronomers and a team of international scientists have discovered a planet, Barnard's Star b, around one of the closest stars to our Sun.
- **Swedish** immunologist Professor Jan Holmgren won the 2018 Prince Mahidol Award in the field of Public Health for his role in testing and proving the efficiency of internationally licensed oral cholera vaccines.
- The **Tunisian** cabinet- the first among Arab nations- approved a law of gender equality in inheritance that would allow men and women to inherit equal amounts.
- First ever plane with no moving parts like propellers or turbine blades, developed by the **American** scientists at MIT, successfully completed its maiden flight.
