- **Spain's** El Celler de Can Roca topped the World's 50 Best Restaurant awards in London.
- **Tanzanian** chemical engineer Dr. Askwar Hilonga won the first Africa Prize for Engineering Innovation for his specialized water-filtration system.
- **American** doctors successfully transplanted, for the first time in the world, a scalp and skull while performing kidney and pancreas transplants in a 15-hour operation.
- **Bangladesh** and **India** signed a historic agreement to simplify their border by exchanging more than 150 enclaves of land.
- **Swiss** tennis star Stanislas Wawrinka won his first French Open title beating Novak Djokovic 4-6 6-4 6-3 6-4 in the final.
- **South Korean** robotics team KAIST and its DRC-Hubo robot won the 2015 Darpa Robotics Challenge and took home \$2 million in prize money.
- In a world first, **Austrian** researchers have successfully fitted a human being with an artificial leg capable of simulating the feelings of a real limb.
- The cabinet of **Czech Republic** approved a ban on smoking in restaurants, bars and cafes.
- **Italian** astronaut Samantha Cristoforetti broke the record for the most time in space on a single mission by a woman.
- The University of Tokyo, **Japan** topped the Times Higher Education Asia University Rankings 2015.
- **Chinese** surgeons successfully separated conjoined twins, at the hip and lower spine, at the Fudan University Children's Hospital in Shanghai.
- The 2015 European Games, the first edition of the multi-sport event for European athletes, was inaugurated in Baku, **Azerbaijan**.
- **Cuban** writer Leonardo Padura was awarded the 2015 Princess of Asturias Award for Literature.
- **South Sudan** has gone seven months without a confirmed case of Guinea worm disease.
- **South African** researchers Professor Jill Farrant was named as recipient of the 2015 Erna Hamburger prize.
- **Iceland** topped the list of the world's most peaceful countries at the 2015 Global Peace Index published by Institute for Economics & Peace.
- **Sweden** won their first ever European Under-21 football title beating Portugal 4-3 on penalties after the teams finished the regulation and extra time at 0-0.
