D+ News: January 2024

- **Belarusian** Aryna Sabalenka successfully defended her Australian Open women's tennis title beating China's Zheng Qinwen 6-3, 6-2 in the final in Melbourne.
- Researchers based in **China** and the **USA** have created the world's first functional semiconductor made from graphene, a single sheet of carbon atoms held together by the strongest bonds known. Their discovery was detailed in Nature.
- Scientists at the University of Central Lancashire in **England** have discovered a huge ring-shaped structure in outer space. Dubbed the Big Ring, the ultra-large structure has a diameter of 1.3 billion light-years and a circumference of 4 billion light-years, making it roughly 15 times the size of the Moon.
- **Ethiopian** Asefa Boki Kebebe claimed the men's title, while his compatriot Bekelech Gudeta Borecha took the women's gold in the 2024 Xiamen Marathon.
- **India** successfully launched its first satellite, named X-ray Polarimeter Satellite, to study black holes as it seeks to deepen its space exploration efforts ahead of an ambitious crewed mission next year.
- **Italian** tennis player Jannik Sinner won the Australian Open men's final beating Daniil Medvedev 3-6 3-6 6-4 6-4 6-3 in Melbourne.
- **Japanese** phenomenon Naoya Inoue was named Ring Magazine's 2023 Fighter of the Year, becoming the first Japanese boxer to win the prestigious award.
- **Kenyan** runner Agnes Ngetich shattered the world record in the women's 10km road race at the 10K Valencia Ibercaja 2024 - setting time of 28:46, becoming the first woman to run the distance in under 29 minutes.
- An international team of archaeologists has found and identified a trackway made by multiple humans approximately 90,000 years ago in **Morocco**, as revealed in the journal Scientific Reports.
- **South Korea's** parliament passed a bill to ban the eating and selling of dog meat, a move that will end the controversial centuries-old practice amid growing support for animal welfare.
- Researchers based in the **USA** and China have created the world's first functional semiconductor made from graphene, a single sheet of carbon atoms held together by the strongest bonds known. Their discovery was detailed in Nature.
- **Japan** became just the fifth country to land a craft named SLIM lander on the moon, after the U.S., Russia, China and India.
