D+ News: August 2023

- Researchers from the University of Sydney in **Australia** have shown that oil molecules retain their 'liquid-like' features when they are chemically bonded as an incredibly thin layer to solid surfaces, creating new opportunities for developing sustainable materials with non-stick characteristics.
- **Bahraini** female runner Winfred Yavi won the 3000m gold medal at the 2023 World Athletics Championships in Budapest.
- Scientists at the Université de Montréal in **Canada** have successfully recreated and mathematically validated how molecules talk to each other to develop new nanotechnologies.
- **China** successfully launched a Kuaizhou-1A carrier rocket to send five new satellites into space from the Xichang Satellite Launch Center in southwest China's Sichuan Province.
- **English** rider Charlie Hatton won the men's mountain bike downhill final at the World Cycling Championships in Fort William.
- **India** became the first country in the world to land a spacecraft, named Chandrayaan-3, near the Moon's south pole and became only the fourth country to land a spacecraft on the moon.
- **Israeli** firm SpacePharma launched a remote-controlled lab into space to conduct medical experiments in a microgravity environment.
- **Jamaican** sprinter Shericka Jackson won the women's 200 metres final at the World Athletics Championships and retained her world title in Budapest.
- **Kenyan** middle and long-distance runner Faith Kipyegon won gold in the 5000m final at the 2023 World Athletics Championship, four days after becoming the first woman to earn a third 1500m gold. She became the first woman to win both events at a single worlds.
- A remarkably preserved ancient flamingo fossil egg between 8,000 and 12,000 years old was uncovered at a busy construction site at the new Felipe Angeles airport in **Mexico**.
- **Norwegian** climber Kristin Harila and her **Nepali** guide Tenjin "Lama" Sherpa were greeted with a heroes' welcome in Nepal after the pair successfully conquered the world's highest peaks, mount Everest, setting the record for the fastest summit of all 14 of the world's 8,000-metre (26,000-foot) mountains, completing the feat in only 92 days.
- Researchers in **Peru** have discovered the fossils of an ancient giant species — named Perucetus colossus, or “the colossal whale from Peru”. Each vertebra of the species weighs over 220 pounds (100 kilograms) and its ribs measure nearly 5 feet (1.4 meters) long.
- First **Russian** transit cargo train travelled through Iran to Saudi Arabia along the key North-South trade route.
- **Spain** won its first Women's Football World Cup title with a 1-0 win over England.
- **Uganda's** long-distance runner Joshua Cheptegei won his third successive World Championship 10,000 meters gold despite an injury-hit year.
- **Welsh** track cyclist Emma Finucane became the first British track rider to win the women's sprint gold at the World Championships for 10 years as she beat Germany's Lea Friedrich in the final.
