- **Algeria** crowned Africa Cup of Nations football champion after beating Senegal 1-0 in the final and ended a 29-year wait for a second Africa Cup of Nations title.
- **Austria's** lower house of parliament passed a bill banning all uses of glyphosate, the controversial pesticide used in weedkiller suspected of causing cancer.
- **Benin** signed up to the African Free Trade Agreement, aimed at greater economic integration between the governments in the region.
- **Brazil** won their first Copa America football title in 12 years beating Peru 3-1 in the final and became the champions of South America.
- Ancient ferrous metallurgy sites of **Burkina Faso** was designated as the UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- A team of **Chinese** and **Japanese** scientists has discovered the highest energy cosmic gamma rays ever observed from an observatory in Tibet, opening a new window to explore the extreme universe.
- **England** won their first ever ODI Cricket World Cup beating New Zealand in the final at Lord's.
- The Spektr-RG telescope, a joint venture between **Germany** and **Russia**, that will map X-rays across the entire sky in unprecedented detail was successfully launched into orbit atop a Proton rocket.
- A team of **Greek** and international researchers has identified a 210,000-year-old skull in Greece as the earliest modern human remains found outside Africa, putting the clock back on mankind's arrival in Europe by more than 150,000 years.
- **India** lifted 271 million people out of poverty over a 10-year period from 2005-2006 to 2015-2016, according to the Multidimensional Poverty Index by the UN Development Programme.
- **Irish** golfer Shane Lowry claimed a first major championship win with a dominant six-shot victory on 15 under par at The British Open.
- **Dutch** artist Rosa Menkman was named as the winner of the first Collide International award in Barcelona.
- **New Zealand** officially banned single-use plastic shopping bags.
- **Pakistani** journalist Zaffar Abbas was awarded the 2019 Gwen Ifill Press Freedom Award by the Committee to Protect Journalists (CPJ) for his extraordinary and sustained achievement in the cause of press freedom.
- The **Philippine** President Rodrigo Duterte signed into law a bill which will impose penalties for gender-based sexual harassment including catcalling and wolf-whistling in public spaces.
- **Romanian** tennis star Simona Halep won the 2019 Wimbledon women's singles title beating Serena Williams 6-2, 6-2 in the final.
- An aircraft built by **South African** teenagers successfully landed in Egypt three weeks after it set off from Cape Town.
