D+ News: April 2024

- Several courageous **Afghan** women received the Kosovo Presidential Medal of Courage in recognition of their services. Zahra Nader, editor-in-chief of Zan Times, Medina Darwazi, Arefa Fatimi, and other Afghan women were given the coveted award by Kosovo President Vjosa Osmani.
- Scientists in **Argentina** have discovered a remarkable new genus and species of small-sized titanosaurian sauropod, named Titanomachya gimenezi. The discovery of Titanomachya gimenezi was described in the journal Historical Biology.
- Researchers at the University of Queensland in **Australia** have built a generator that absorbs carbon dioxide (CO₂) to make electricity.
- **Belgian** world champion Lotte Kopecky won a six-rider dash for the line to claim the women's Paris-Roubaix cobbled classic.
- Scientists in **China** have discovered the tracks of a 5 metre-long, with 1.8-metre-long legs, raptor dinosaur, challenging what was previously known about the species' size range, as published in iScience - Cell Press.
- **English** scientists have identified a gigantic marine reptile dating to 202 million years ago that appears to have been among the largest animals ever on Earth. Researchers revealed in Plos ONE, the bone, called a surangular, was from a type of ocean-going reptile called an ichthyosaur.
- **Iranian**-French filmmaker and cartoonist Marjane Satrapi won the 2024 Princess of Asturias Foundation award for communication and humanities.
- **Iraq, Turkey, Qatar** and the **United Arab Emirates** signed a memorandum of understanding in Baghdad to cooperate on the Iraq Development Road project that would connect the Gulf to Europe, during a visit by Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan.
- **Israeli** mathematician Avi Wigderson won the A.M. Turing Award from the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM), recognizing his profound contributions to the mathematical underpinnings of computation.
- **Kenyan** long-distance runner and Olympic champion Peres Jepchirchir smashed the women's-only world record to win a thrilling London Marathon in two hours, 16 minutes and 16 seconds.
- Jamaica officially recognised the State of **Palestine** following deliberations in the Cabinet the previous day.
- **Spanish** footballer Aitana Bonmati won the Laureus World Sportswoman of the Year award, becoming the first footballer to win the prize.
- **Sweden's** Armand Duplantis broke his own pole vault world record for an eight time with a 6.24-meter effort in the first Diamond League meeting of the 2024 season.
- In a groundbreaking discovery, scientists in the **USA** have uncovered the first known structure in complex cells that's capable of drawing nitrogen from the atmosphere and converting it into a form that the cell can use.
