

D+ News: May 2018

- **Argentine** football superstar Lionel Messi claimed record fifth European Golden Shoe award after ending La Liga season with 34 goals for Barcelona.
- **Australian** scientists have discovered the fastest growing black hole known in the universe, describing it as a monster that devours a mass equivalent to our sun every two days.
- The Bangabandhu-1 (BD-1), **Bangladesh's** first commercial satellite, was successfully launched by SpaceX from the Kennedy Space Center in Cape Canaveral, Florida.
- **Barbados** elected Mia Mottley as its first woman Prime Minister since gaining independence from Britain in 1966.
- University of Toronto, **Canada** researchers have developed a handheld 3D skin printer that deposits even layers of skin tissue to cover and heal deep wounds.
- **Costa Rica** and **Russia** signed an intergovernmental agreement on the visa-free travel, scraping visa formalities for the mutual visits of Russian and Costa Rican citizens.
- **Egyptian** footballer Mohamed Salah won the Premier League's Player of the Season for his performance with Liverpool.
- In breakthrough, **French** surgeons at the Avicenne Hospital have built windpipes from arteries, according to the details published in the Journal of the American Medical Association.
- A team of researchers from **Germany** and **Japan** have found evidence in a lunar meteorite that water once existed on the moon, according to their paper published on the open access site Science Advances.
- **Ireland** became the 11th nation to play Test cricket, the highest level of cricket, when they faced Pakistan at Dublin's Malahide ground.
- Netta Barzilai of **Israel** won the 2018 Eurovision Song Contest in Lisbon with the song Toy. It was Israel's fourth Eurovision title.
- **Japanese** film director Hirokazu Kore-eda's Shoplifters won Palme d'Or at the 71st Cannes Film Festival.
- **Pakistan's** parliament passed a law guaranteeing basic rights for transgender citizens and outlawing discrimination by both employers and private business owners, a move hailed as historic.
- The Shura Council of **Saudi Arabia**, the country's formal consultative body, approved a law to criminalize sexual harassment in the kingdom.
- **Scottish** researchers have discovered that tough conditions like environmental stresses are responsible for making the human brain disproportionately large, according to their research published in Nature.
- **Spanish** astronomer Salvador Barquin has detected a new binary star system in the Draco constellation in the far northern sky.
