D+ News: February 2024

- Researchers at the University of New South Wales (UNSW) in **Australia** have demonstrated multiple ways to write quantum information in silicon for more flexible quantum chips design. Their discovery was detailed in Nature Communications.
- **Chinese** tech giant Huawei's innovative green antenna series clinched the GSMA Global Mobile (GLOMO) Award for 'Best Mobile Network Infrastructure' at the Mobile World Congress (MWC) Barcelona 2024.
- **Cote d'Ivoire** sealed a magnificent Africa Cup of Nations football title triumph after coming from behind to beat Nigeria 2-1 in the final.
- **English** researchers have discovered a never-before-seen pterosaur, named Ceoptera evansae, on the Isle of Skye in Scotland. The newly discovered creature lived 168 to 166 million years ago, as revealed in the Journal of Vertebrate Paleontology.
- **Georgian** fighter Ilia Topuria knocked out Alexander Volkanovski, arguably the best featherweight in MMA history, with a lethal combination in the second round to become the UFC featherweight champion.
- A research team led by the University of Göttingen in **Germany** have found new clues about the formation and composition of ancient biomass in rocks that are around 3.5 billion years old containing traces of the microorganisms that lived at that time.
- **Italian** Jasmine Paolini battled back from a set and a break down to beat Anna Kalinskaya 4-6, 7-5, 7-5 to secure her first WTA 1000 tennis title at the Dubai Duty Free Tennis Championships.
- **Japan** successfully launched its next-generation H3 rocket into orbit carrying a dummy satellite and two functioning microsattellites.
- **Malawi** lifted visa requirements for visitors from 79 countries, in a move to boost the tourism sector, Malawi President Lazarus Chakwera informed the country's Parliament.
- **Namibian** cricketer Jan Nicol Loftie-Eaton hit a hundred off just 33 balls against Nepal, making him the quickest man to reach the milestone in Men's T20 Cricket.
- Marrit Steenbergen of the **Netherlands** delivered a sprinting masterclass to seal the women's 100m freestyle world title at the Doha 2024 World Aquatics Championships.
- Host **Qatar** became back-to-back champions at the AFC Asian Cup Football tournament by beating Jordan 3-1 in the final.
- **Russia** successfully launched a Soyuz-2 rocket carrying the Progress MS-26 cargo ship to the International Space Station.
- Eight-year-old Ashwath Kaushik of **Singapore** became the youngest player to defeat a grandmaster in classical chess beating Poland's Jacek Stopa at the Burgdorfer Stadthaus Open in Switzerland.
- **South African** singer Tyla won her first Grammy Award for her hit song Water in the Best African Music Performance category at the 66th Annual Grammy Awards.
