D+ News: March 2023

- **Chinese** scientists have discovered glass-like beads buried on the moon that could contain billions of tons of water, as published in the journal Nature Geoscience. The incredible discovery of over a million glass spherical beads was made by China after the analysis of soil samples that were brought back to Earth by its Chang'e 5 mission.
- Scientists in **Egypt** have discovered a hidden passage inside Egypt's Great Pyramid, at the ancient site in Giza also known as the Khufu, or Cheops, pyramid, Egypt's Tourism and Antiquities Ministry revealed.
- **English** architect, urban planner and activist, Sir David Alan Chipperfield CH won the 2023 Laureate of The Pritzker Architecture Prize, the award that is regarded internationally as architecture's highest honor.
- **Honduras** established diplomatic ties with China at a ceremony in the Diaoyutai State Guesthouse in Beijing.
- **Indian** heavy lift rocket LVM3 successfully took the 36 satellites, weighing a total of 5.8 tonnes, of UK-based OneWeb Group to space.
- **Iran** and **Saudi Arabia** agreed to re-establish diplomatic relations after seven-year rift, as the announcement came after four days of talks between officials from both sides in China.
- **Japanese** figure skater Kaori Sakamoto became the first Japanese woman to defend her title at the figure skating world championships.
- A team of international researchers, including scientists from **Kenya**, has revealed that Africans and Asians were intermingling along the East African coast more than a thousand years ago. Their findings were published in the Nature journal.
- **Mexican** driver Sergio Perez won the 2023 F1 Saudi Arabia Grand Prix from pole position representing Red Bull.
- **Dutch** cyclist Mathieu van der Poel won the 2023 Milan-San Remo race, becoming just the fourth Dutch rider to win the Italian monument.
- **Peru's** Kimberly Garcia Leon broke the 35 km race walk world record with a time of two hours 37 minutes and 44 seconds in Dudince, Slovakia.
- **Russian** President Vladimir Putin and **Chinese** President Xi Jinping signed economic cooperation agreements during President Xi's visit to Moscow.
- A team of researchers in **Singapore** has developed a revolutionary technique for producing ultrathin inorganic membranes that are energy-efficient and highly customisable for different applications.
- **Tunisian** director Youssef Chebbi won the coveted Stallion of Yennenga award at the biennial pan-African Fespaco Film and Television festival for his murder mystery oeuvre "Ashkal.
