D+ News: October 2015

- **Australia** successfully launched one of the world's most-advanced communication satellites Sky Muster into orbit.
- The Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine 2015 was awarded, one half jointly to William
 C. Campbell of Ireland and Satoshi Ōmura of Japan for their discoveries concerning a
 novel therapy against infections caused by roundworm parasites and the other half to
 Youyou Tu of China for her discoveries concerning a novel therapy against Malaria.
- Professor Takaaki Kajita of Japan and Professor Arthur B. McDonald of Canada jointly won the Nobel Prize in Physics for 2015 for the discovery of neutrino oscillations, which shows that neutrinos have mass.
- The Nobel Prize in Chemistry for 2015 was jointly awarded to Tomas Lindahl of Sweden, Aziz Sancar of Turkey and Paul Modrich of the USA for mechanistic studies of DNA repair.
- The Nobel Prize in Literature for 2015 was awarded to the **Belarusian** author Svetlana Alexievich for her polyphonic writings, a monument to suffering and courage in our time.
- The Nobel Peace Prize for 2015 was awarded to the Tunisian National Dialogue Quartet for its decisive contribution to the building of a pluralistic democracy in **Tunisia** in the wake of the revolution in 2011.
- The **Chilean** government announced the creation of the largest marine reserve in the Americas in its Pacific waters where commercial fishing will be restricted.
- The Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences for 2015 was awarded to **Scottish** economist Angus Deaton for his analysis of consumption, poverty, and welfare.
- **Kazakh** film director Yerlan Nurmukhambetov's Walnut Tree was presented with the New Currents Award at the 20th Busan International Film Festival.
- The Government of New Zealand reported a budget surplus for the first time since 2008.
- Jamaican novelist Marlon James won the 2015 Man Booker Prize for his novel A Brief History of Seven Killings.
- United Nations General Assembly elected Egypt, Japan, Senegal, Ukraine and Uruguay to serve as non-permanent members on the Security Council for two-year terms beginning on 1 January 2016.
- The Ministry of Defence of **India** has approved the induction of women into the Fighter (Combat) stream of the Indian Air Force.
- Nepal's parliament elected politician and women's rights activist Bidhya Bhandari as the country's first female president.
- **China** announced the end of its hugely unpopular one-child policy to allow all couples to have two children.
