## D+ News: February 2023

- **Australia** won the Women's T20 Cricket World Cup for the sixth time as they defeated South Africa by 19 runs in the final at Newlands, Cape Town.
- Green Textile Limited's unit-4, located in Mymensingh's Bhaluka, in **Bangladesh** made it to the top on the list of world's best eco-friendly factories as per US Green Building Council (USGBC)'s standard certificate.
- **Chilean** swimmer Barbara Hernandez became the first person to swim 2.5 kilometers through the icy waters of Antarctica.
- **China** successfully sent a new remote sensing satellite via a Long March-2C carrier rocket into space from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Center in northwest China. The launch was the 464th flight mission of the Long March carrier rocket series.
- Jack Laugher of **England** was named LEN European diver of the year after his stunning year off the boards was recognised by both public voters and those involved in the sport.
- **Ethiopian** runner Lamecha Girma broke a 25-year-old indoor world record in the 3,000 meters at the Meeting Hauts-de-France Pas-de-Calais, covering the distance in 7 minutes, 23.81 seconds.
- The **Indian** Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully launched its second developmental flight of a Small Satellite Launch Vehicle — SSLV-D2 — and placed three satellites in its precise orbit.
- The **Mexican** space agency, Agencia Espacial Mexicana (AEM) and European Space Agency (ESA) signed a Cooperation Agreement with an aim to allow Mexico and ESA to create a framework for more-intensive cooperation in joint projects in the future.
- **Russian** scientists have discovered a 3,500-year-old brown bear, almost perfectly preserved in the frozen wilds of eastern Siberia, as widely reported by the Lazarev Mammoth Museum Laboratory at the North-Eastern Federal University in Yakutsk.
- Researchers in **South Africa** have unearthed 360 million-year-old fossils belonging to a newly described voracious fish species that preyed on humans' ancestors.
- **Sweden's** Armand Duplantis broken his own pole vault world record with an amazing clearance of 6.22m at the World Athletics (WA) indoor meet in Clermont-Ferrand, France.
- The **United Arab Emirates (UAE)** inaugurated the World's Largest Solar-Powered Data Centre at Dubai's Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Solar Park.
- **American** scientists have discovered a new layer of partly molten rock under the Earth's crust that might help settle a long-standing debate about how tectonic plates move. The research was published in the journal Nature Geoscience.
- The authorities in **Zambia** passed a law that prohibits pedestrians from crossing the road while wearing headsets or talking on a mobile phone.
